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The Kagyu school of Tibetan Buddhism gets its name from the Tibetan རྒྱུ་མཚན་ལྷན་པོ་ meaning "oral lineage" or "whispered transmission". While it traces its origin back to Buddha Shakyamuni, the most important source for the specific practices of the Kagyu order is the great Indian yogi Tilopa (988-1069).
